THE STUDY OF 1 PETER & 2 PETER LESSON 11 1 PETER 3:8-12 QUESTIONS

Ask the Lord to prepare your heart as you study His word. Read 1 Peter 3:8-12.

As we have studied, Peter is writing to believers that are suffering, being persecuted, slandered, resented and hated. In our study today Peter essentially, is saying..." If you are going to love life and see good days, in spite of what you are going through, here is what you need to do..."

In verse 8 Peter gives us five attitudes of the heart. Define each.

1. Harmonious:
a. Does this mean that we must agree on everything? What would "harmonious" look like during a dispute in our body of Christ? What actions would contribute to or detract from the harmony of our body?
2. Sympathetic:
a. Give some synonyms and antonyms of sympathetic.
b. As you look at the antonyms of sympathetic, do you see areas in your life where you are unsympathetic? Which people in your life are you most unsympathetic to? What are some recurring situations where you are unsympathetic?
3. Brotherly:
a. What commands do these verses give us on brotherly love?

6. Peter goes on in verse 9 to explain that we must make the right response.

FOR THE EYES OF THE LORD ARE TOWARD THE RIGHTEOUS, AND HIS EARS ATTEND TO THEIR PRAYER, BUT THE FACE OF THE LORD IS AGAINST THOSE WHO DO EVIL (vs. 12)
