Obstacle to Evangelism #3: We think evangelism is only for specially gifted Christians. Every Christian is called to worship God by proclaiming the Gospel. Who or what you trust reveals what you worship. Every Christian can explain to other people where they should be placing their trust. Everyone is prone to false worship—putting your trust in the wrong things. So, when we evangelize, we worship God by proclaiming to others where they need to place their trust. Worshipers of God place all their trust in Jesus.
