## "Encouragement from Exodus"

## Selected Passages

In our message today we will be reviewing some of the key events which preceded the Exodus of the Children of Israel from Egypt after 400 extremely difficult years of slavery. We will also see that in their bondage the people cried out and God heard them, setting things in motion for their deliverance. We will highlight the people's response of worship once they received the message that God had heard their cry.

The key applications have to do with the nature of prayer, God's commitment to His people, and what our response ought to be when God answers our prayers.
