

“Thanksgiving For The Lord’s Saving Goodness”
Psalm 118:1-29

This psalm completes the group of *Hallel* songs—song of accent (Ps. 113-118). Possibly Psalm 118 was written for the Feast of Tabernacles, perhaps even the first celebration of that Feast when the people returned from the Exile. It can be said that the contents describe a festal procession to the sanctuary to sacrifice to and praise the Lord. Because the song was sung at the festivals, expressions in the psalm were on the lips of the people at Jesus’ entry into Jerusalem at the beginning of the Passion Week; Matt. 21:9). Also this psalm may have been sung in the Upper Room after the Lord’s Supper (Matt. 26:30).

This psalm in its Old Testament setting, however, was a song for praising the Lord’s loyal love. The psalmist recounted how the Lord triumphed over all the nations surrounding Israel. Then he exulted in the fact that their salvation was God’s marvelous work and that the stone which the builders rejected had become the prominent part of God’s work, which points to salvation in Christ Jesus.
